

The child's birth certificate as well as the godparent's "sponsor certificate" (godparents must be Confirmed practicing Catholics) must be presented before a date is finalized.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Today's gospel makes sense if we remember something that St. Paul wrote, "[N]o eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him" (1 Corinthians 2:9). Jesus's opponents viewed God's Kingdom through what they knew. Jesus is saying that God's promise is beyond our understanding. We will never comprehend God and how He is unfolding His plan.

Likewise, we hear in the second reading, our call to believe in God doesn't mean that we will have all the answers to problems, but to be faithful. "But the Lord is faithful; he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one. We are confident of you in the Lord that what we instruct you, you are doing and will continue to do." (2 Thessalonians 3:3-4).

This needs to be remembered as you read the financial report on the back inside page of our bulletin. Again, this year, our income did not meet up to our expectations; it continues to slide. Even with trying as hard as we did to keep expenses below last year, the deficit has grown. Basically, that is because of the drop in regular contributions. In the middle, you will see a line dividing the page. Everything above that is our income and expenses that we deal with each year. The numbers below the line show the out-of-the-ordinary moneys that we have. They are (1) money received and spent for the construction projects we are involved in and (2) the bequest we received in 2018. Like any household, we do not want to think of savings as the solution to immediate problems. Once it is spent, it cannot be recovered.

I deeply appreciate the support that comes to us. Many of you support us on a regular basis, and this shows the bonds that make us a community. Some, however, give in a random way and/or out of a habit that has not changed. In light of this report, I ask that you review your support and see if you can help us in this challenge.
