Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

For a change of pace on these Sundays until Labor Day, I'm offering examples of people from the 20th century whose lives give us a chance to appreciate the different ways that faith can be lived and shared. ~**Fr. Jiw**

Howard Thurman Theologian and Mystic (1899–1981)

Howard Thurman, who was born in segregated Daytona Beach, Florida, was raised by his mother and grandmother - the latter, a former slave. From her, he said, he learned "more about the genius of the religion of Jesus than from all the men who taught me Greek. Because she moved inside the experience and lived out of that kind of center."

After studies at Morehouse College in Atlanta, Thurman studied for ministry at Rochester Theological Seminary. A turning point in his life came in 1935 when he traveled for six months in India and met Mohandas Gandhi. On his return he became an early link between Gandhi's idea of nonviolence and the later civil rights movement. (Martin Luther King later cited Thurman as an inspiration.) But his travels also caused him to think more critically about Christianity and its compromises with social injustice. From this came his book *Jesus and the Disinherited*, which examined the ministry of Jesus as a resource for resolving the race crisis. Thurman saw Jesus as a member of an oppressed people, living under occupation, united with all the disinherited people of the world.

In later books Thurman explored the nature of religious experience: "the finding of man by God and the finding of God by man." Thurman's brand of mysticism was an intense awareness of "a conscious and direct exposure" to God, a relationship in which "we find our true dignity and the sacred core of our being." He died on April 10, 1981.

"Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive, and go do it. Because what the world needs is people who have come alive."


