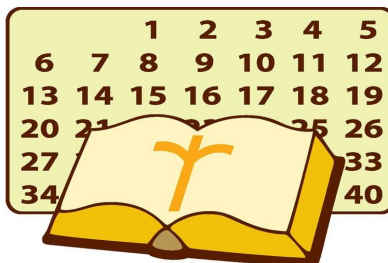

## Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Due to the ransomware attack on our computers early in August, one of the people from the 20<sup>th</sup> century whose lives invite us to look at our faith in broader ways could not be printed. Here it is, a month later and the last of the series. – **Fr. Jim**

### Oskar Schindler “Righteous Gentile” (1908–1974)

Among the heroes of the Holocaust, the German industrialist Oskar Schindler cuts a curious figure. Not a man of evident faith or even conventional virtue, he was in fact an opportunist, a philanderer, a member of the Nazi Party who made a fortune employing Jewish slave labor in occupied Poland. But at some point his moral compass shifted. His factory became a haven; the rescue and preservation of “his Jews” became, in fact, his only real business.

To this end he used his considerable wiles, desperately widening the tenuous circle of life. The personal dangers he faced only emboldened him in his audacious mission. As the Jewish population in Poland was steadily decimated, Schindler transferred his entire workforce of 1,100 to Czechoslovakia. The factory was a con game. Though guarded by SS troops and run with apparent efficiency, it produced nothing. Schindler spent his entire fortune to keep the operation running until May 1945 when the war ended. He shamed the guards into disobeying their orders to exterminate the surviving workers.

No one, least of all “Schindler’s Jews,” doubts that what he did was good. But why did he do it? His Catholic upbringing supplies no clear explanation. He lived out his life in obscurity. But as his story became known he was inducted into the list of Righteous Gentiles. After his death in 1974 he was buried, by his request, in Jerusalem.

**“He who saves one life saves the entire world.”**

—Words from the Talmud, inscribed in a gold ring presented to Schindler by his Jewish workers.

## Summer is Past, Now we Look for Heat



The work continues in the Parish Center for our new furnace. As you can see in the photos above, the panel holding the controls has been modified and the base of the old boiler has been further removed.

It is our hope that now that Labor day is behind us and with the prep

work done, the new boiler will soon find it way to the boiler room.

Meanwhile, we are rethinking the auditorium work (due to the high estimates) preparing to ask for re-bidding, with work to begin in late May 2020.

### Proposed Schedule of Work

**PHASE I** **Fall 2018**

**Approximate Cost: \$450,000**

- Replace the Church Entrance Bridge and Side Stairways
- Mandated Removal of the oil tank in the Parish Center and replace the Boiler
- Update the Kitchen in the Auditorium

**PHASE II** **Fall 2019**

**Approximate Cost: \$290,000**

- Update Auditorium Bathrooms and Replace Parish Center's Handicapped lift
- Add Handicapped Parking spaces and Re-coat & re-stripe the Parking lot
- Install new padding on the kneelers

**PHASE III** **Fall 2020**

**Approximate Cost: \$210,000**

- Update Fire and Security Alarm systems in the Church and Parish Center
- Replace the Sidewalks
- Replace the Windows in the Parish Center
