

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Our first reading is unusual. God has run out of mercy and is ready to show folks who's in charge. It is Moses, we are given to understand, who "talks God down off the ledge." Of course, God does not need the input of any human being to strengthen his patience with us. But, this is a powerful picture of how deeply God feels the weight of our indifference and infidelity. But, even in the face of his love being rejected and unappreciated, God is merciful.

This is true in other stories in the Bible. God shows a remarkable tenderness to Adam and Eve in fashioning clothes for them once they learned shame. This same kindness is extended to Cain in protecting him with a special mark and repeated countless times in the Hebrew scriptures: to Elijah when his courage fails under the broom tree, to Jonah when he sulks under the shade of the gourd plant. While there are events in the Old Testament attributed to "God's wrath"—flood, fire, famine, and pestilence, to name a few—God is understood at the same time to relent quite easily and show remarkable restraint for someone who has the power to crush opposition absolutely at a moment's notice.

Our appreciation of God as the source of abundant mercy comes to full flower in the revelation of Jesus Christ, naturally. After the example of Jesus' teaching, healing, suffering, dying, and ultimate forgiving, can we have any doubts that God's greatest desire for us is to reconcile us to heaven? Our Gospel today is a touching example of that truth. – Fr. Jim
