

BAPTISMS: Prospective parents should telephone the Parish Center about three months before the expected birth to discuss the arrangements for your child's baptism and enroll you in the required baptismal class. Baptism classes are held monthly on the 1st or 2nd Sunday of the month. The baptism date will be set at the time of the class. The child's birth certificate as well as the godparent's "sponsor certificate" (godparents must be Confirmed practicing Catholics) must be presented before a date is finalized.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

St. John the Baptist's call to repentance and his threats in today's Gospel certainly do not sound "Christmas-y"! He did get it correct when he said that someone greater is coming. However, he missed the mark when he then declared that the Expected One would cast out sinners. Jesus began with the hinge message of John: Repent, for the Kingdom is at hand. BUT, then Jesus proclaims a new vision of the Kingdom of God: Sinners are now forgiven! The lame walk and the blind see! The dead rise again!

John emphasized the "repent" side of the prophets' message. Jesus spends more time telling stories of the Kingdom and its ways. John isn't wrong; but he cannot wrap his head around Jesus's message – he never becomes follower of Jesus. His job is to be the last signpost on the way to the future. John seemed to know this, as when he later acknowledged the need to decrease as Jesus increases. Maybe his recognition that the old prophetic style was passing made it easier for John to speak the truth to power.

Something has to die in order for something else to live, the botanists tell us. Scripture has the same message. We have to let go of the past, the old ways, the old self, in order to usher in the new life we long for. How can these Advent weeks help us to do this important task? $\sim Fr$. Jún




