

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

St. John the Baptist's question, "Are you the One who is to come?" is among the most fascinating questions in the New Testament. First, it is the question on the minds of anyone who encounters Jesus (then and now). A simple yes or no would suffice, but in typical Jesus fashion the answer is more challenging. We all are looking for a Savior, but is one who cures and comforts outcasts the person we had in mind? Basically Jesus' message to John is: Here are the facts. It is for you to decide.

Second, what is so amazing about John's question is the level of trust it implies. John was confident Jesus would tell him the truth. In fact, John already knew the truth. If he hadn't been convinced Jesus was the Messiah, he would have never posed the question.

When you find yourself in doubt of who Jesus is, first think about Jesus' answer to John: Is the one who brings good news to the poor, helps the blind see, and deaf hear the savior you had in mind? If not, then perhaps you're on the wrong path--or more probably unaware of your own needs. Second think about John's question. If you are asking Jesus whether or not he is your savior, chances are you already know the answer ~ Fr. Jim

Faith Formation

How to Teach Children to Pray

QUESTION: What are some suggestions for how to teach children to pray?

ANSWER: God has specific purposes in how to teach children to pray. When a child is asked how to solve the world's problems, their answer is succinct and short. A child's worldview is how God intended man to live in harmony with each other. So too, is a child's view to prayer.

"Therefore, anyone who becomes as humble as this little child is the greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven" (Matthew 18:4). If you ever get sick with an incurable disease and medical processes have failed, ask a child to pray for your healing. People who know how to teach a child to pray, empowers that child for life to pray without doubting. Children pray with an honest and simple belief that holds no biases. I've seen many miracles come about through a child's prayer. Children pray with simplicity and faith. Adults learn to doubt, causing disbelief and unanswered prayers.

**Be sure the children know that the purpose of prayer is to talk to God.

**Talk through and discuss the Lord's Pray (Matthew 6:9-13), not as a rote ritual to repeat, but as an example of what to include in a prayer. The Lord's Prayer teaches us to address God with respect, request our daily needs to Him, ask for forgiveness, know that God protects us from evil, and to close our petitions with honor, respect, thankfulness, and praise.

**Encourage children to start with simple sentence prayers like, "I thank God for..." or "I pray for..." More complex prayers will come.

**Pray in front of your children, so they can learn by your example. Pray together as a family.

Hints for the Flu Season

Since we are in the flu season, we are offering two practical directives to assist the congregation during Mass. The "Sign of Peace" does not have to be a handshake. Turning to those near you and offering a slight bow with a verbal wish without touching is proper. Be mindful of the symptoms of colds and the flu. If you have any symptoms, please refrain from receiving the Precious Blood from the Communion Cup.

Also, getting a flu shot is a way of helping yourself & others.

Low Gluten Altar Breads

Do you or anyone in your family have a problem with wheat products? This allergy often prevents people from sharing in Communion completely because they cannot receive the Host. We have special hosts made by a Convent in the Midwest that many people have been able to use, because there is only 0.01% gluten in these hosts. For info, check their website BENEDICTINESISTERS.ORG. IMPORTANT: if you are gluten intolerant, consult with your doctor before use.

If you wish to receive one of these hosts, please let the priest celebrating Mass know before Mass so he can have one for you, then go to him at communion. As you receive, please remind him that you need a "special host."
