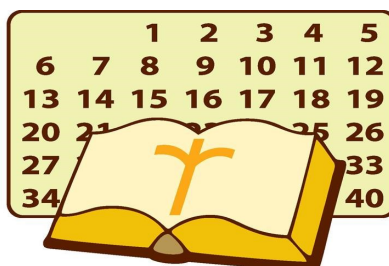

PARISH MEMBERSHIP: We welcome all new parishioners! We ask them to register at the Parish Center and encourage the use of weekly envelopes. If you are moving, please notify the office.

MARRIAGES: Couples should make arrangements in person at least one year in advance for required interview. At least one of the parties must live within the parish boundaries, or be a registered member of the parish. Please call the Parish Center for an appointment. No dates will be set over the telephone.

BAPTISMS: Prospective parents should telephone the Parish Center about three months before the expected birth to discuss the arrangements for your child's baptism and enroll you in the required baptismal class. Baptism classes are held monthly on the 1st or 2nd Sunday of the month. The baptism date will be set at the time of the class. The child's birth certificate as well as the godparent's "sponsor certificate" (godparents must be Confirmed practicing Catholics) must be presented before a date is finalized.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

"Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord!" – Psalm 119

Many of us can feel conflicted regarding "law." We are thankful that there are laws in place to protect us and our property from other people. At the same time we look on laws that inconvenience us in a different way. Tax laws, traffic laws, and municipal laws are three kinds of rules some of us are comfortable breaking if we think we can get away with it.

Perhaps that is why TV series and movies where the moral lines are vague between the good guys and the bad ones (*The Godfather, The Sopranos, Breaking Bad*) fascinate us. We're attracted to stories that deal with an uncomfortable truth: people are ready to break the law given the right set of circumstances. Perhaps we come to think most laws are neither good nor bad but arbitrary. If a given law crosses our goals or basic self-interest, we might be willing to look the other way—just this once.

Biblical law was established to be a different kind of law altogether from this modern idea of law. The Hebrew word for *law* is more like "guidance" or "instruction" than a line drawn in the sand. Divine law wasn't viewed as negatively prohibitive or punitive but positive and helpful. The point wasn't to constrict human freedom but to keep people safe, happy, and at peace.

After all, a red light isn't meant to make you late for an appointment—even if it does just that; it's intended to keep you and the other drivers safe. Law was deemed so positive in ancient Israel that psalms were written to praise the life lived lawfully. God's gift of law is evidence that God is serious about wanting to preserve the happiness His people. When Jesus extends the laws as deep and high as you can conceive, is this his way of making life harder—or simpler than ever? ~Fr. Jim

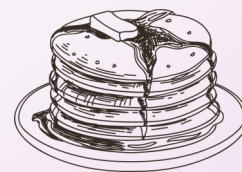

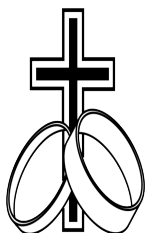

The Census Bureau will never ask for Social Security numbers; bank or credit card numbers; money or donations; anything on behalf of a political party. Ways to Give

Gifts of Cash – Checks should be made payable to the “Catholic Ministries Appeal,” and you can pledge your gift over ten months.

Credit Card – We accept American Express, Discover, Mastercard and Visa. Simply provide your credit card information on your pledge card/envelope or give online at www.drvc.org/CMA.

Matching Gifts – Go to WWW.MATCHINGGIFTS.COM/DRVC to see if your employer will match the charitable contributions of employees.

IRA Charitable Rollover – If you are at least 70½ years old on the date you make your gift and your IRA is a traditional or Roth, you can transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA to charity – without incurring income taxes today or estate tax in the future.

Gift of Securities – Federal tax laws allow a charitable deduction for the full market value of securities on the date of your gift.
