Family members, please resubmit names for those who are ill. We will list them for 4 weeks, and then remove them unless told otherwise. Please note-due to privacy issues, we can include names given by the individual or a health care proxy only. Thank you.

Here we are already at the end of September and our post-summer schedules have become routines at this point. As reminders, I call attention to the following matters.

Enrichment Evenings: They have begun. We had our first one on Monday the 19th in the basement of the parish center. The turn-out was quite good. I emphasize that these evenings are primarily for our catechists who work with our youngsters under religious instruction. They are also open to all parishioners. We meet at 7:30 PM and we end at 9:00 PM. The next topic considered in our series is **Christ.**

In October, we meet on the 3rd, the 17th and the 24th. There is no meeting on the 10th in honor of our Columbus Day observance.

Twenty Minutes with the Director/Pastor: It debuted on Sunday the 18th. It involves the children enrolled in religious instruction and the parents coming to catechesis for **twenty minutes** before the 10:00 AM Mass. We have scheduled these sessions with the various **levels** in mind. We ask the students and their parents to attend when it is their turn. Kindly cooperate that we mAight be better informed about our Catholic faith and be better at practicing that faith.

Eucharistic Revival: We continue to emphasize the irreplaceability of the Eucharist to the Catholic faith. We ask all of our parishioners to be more conscious of this treasure in our midst and adopt what the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* calls a **eucharistic** attitude in the way we live and follow the Lord. He, Jesus that is, told us that He is the Bread come down from heaven. Those who eat His Body and drink His Blood will not die but will live forever. (cf. Jn 6) We ask you to join us for Eucharistic Adoration when it is offered at Saint Margaret, and to attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation.

For those who are interested, the document authorizing the **Eucharistic Revival** is available online. Its title is *The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church*. It was composed by a committee within the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. I encourage you to read this document. It is not excessively long, and is quite suitable as the basis for personal reflection.

Mass Intentions: Masses at Saint Margaret have what we call Mass Intentions, and that would be persons who are remembered at the altar and whose names are mentioned in the Prayer of the Faithful. All of our weekend Masses have Intentions as do our Daily Masses Monday through Friday at 9:00 AM.

I encourage you to consider having a relative or friend (deceased or living) remembered at one of these Masses. The very best way to remember a relative or friend is to assist in having him or her be counted among the saints in heaven. That is what the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass does for those who are no longer with us on earth. We refer to that spiritual gift as a fruit of the Mass. If our greatest joy is to be with the Lord without end, then it makes sense that we avail ourselves of the means that will bring that desired outcome to fruition.

October 2nd: This year because it is a Sunday, we do not mark the Memorial of the Guardian Angels at the Liturgy. Instead, it is the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time. It is also Respect Life Sunday. I encourage you to remember the unborn children whose lives have been taken through abortion since its legalization by the Supreme Court in 1973. As you know, the Supreme Court decision in *Dobbs* a few months ago reversed *Roe*, and abortion remans now a matter for the States to decide through their legislative bodies. We continue to be grateful for the *Dobbs* decision. But we cannot become complacent. The pro-life cause always needs your support, especially in a State like New York. Learn about what you can do to help unborn children through the various *Life Centers* which are located here on Long Island.

I ask you to consider attending **Stand Up for Life** at Route 110 in Melville for a prayerful, peaceful and public witness to the sanctity of unborn life. The event begins at 2:00 PM and finishes at 3:30 PM. Consider going by yourself or with a group. I will be there.

Mission Cooperative Appeal: This weekend, Fr. Eugene will be at Saint Margaret to conduct the **Mission Cooperative Appeal.** He will offer two Masses and preach at all four of our weekend Masses. I ask you to remember the Church's missions in your prayers and to support those same missions financially with the treasure portion of your stewardship.

Blessed are the wanderers

Biblical prophets warn the comfortable not to overlook the suffering of those less fortunate. A mass exodus to the West of Soviet bloc refugees prompted Pope Pius XII, future Pope Paul VI, and layman James Norris to form the International Catholic Migration Commission. The ICMC continued its response to the "boat people" of Vietnam, Bosnian Muslims, Afghani refugees, and more. Their efforts restore dignity, inspire change, and companion the displaced. Welcome the stranger.

Believed to have been twin brothers, Cosmas and Damian were third-century Christian Syrian physicians who accepted no payment for caring for the sick—and made many converts as a result of their selfless service. They were eventually martyred by the Romans. Many of us know "saints" in the healthcare profession who work physically and emotionally demanding jobs, make personal sacrifices (including endangering their own health during the pandemic), and have a seemingly endless supply of compassion despite it all. The next time you or someone you love needs medical help, ask Cosmas and Damian to support the professionals coming to your aid.

Enrich the faith of others

Before co-founding the Daughters of Charity—serving the "poorest of the poor"—Saint Vincent de Paul began the Congregation of the Mission in 1625. Priests who joined had three requirements: to live in imitation of Christ, to take the gospel to the rural poor, and to educate fellow priests in the practical matters of being a priest. When he realized peasants knew so little about the faith and that local priests were poorly trained in administering the sacrament of Penance, Vincent preached such a stirring parish mission that priests from a nearby town had to be called in to help him hear confessions. How can you help others practice their faith?

Carry on the work of the dead among the living

At the time of Jesus, the Jewish custom was to bury a person in the family burial cave the same day they died. The body was left for a year while the family mourned, the first seven days in *shivah*, followed by a less intense 30-day period of *shloshim*. The burial rite was not complete, however, as the family would return to the cave a year later for the "second burial," the collection of remains to be placed with the bones of other ancestors in the family ossuary. It is theorized that when Jesus commented, "Let the dead

bury their dead," he may have been referring to this second burial, suggesting to his disciples that there was more urgent work to be done among the living. Pray for the dead but serve the living!

TODAY'S READINGS: Job 9:1-12, 14-16; Luke 9:57-62 (457). "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the Kingdom of God."

Angels watching over us

Today we honor the only three angels in scripture who have names. Michael is cited in the books of Daniel and Revelation and is known for being a protector. Gabriel is most famously a messenger, having relayed information to Daniel, but best known for giving Mary the news that she would be mother to our Savior. Raphael is associated with healing and appears in a series of adventures in the Book of Tobit, including his cure of Tobit's blindness. At various times, each of us needs protection, a message from God, or healing. May these three archangels lift our prayers when we and our communities most need these things.

FEAST OF MICHAEL, GABRIEL, AND RAPHAEL, ARCHANGELS TODAY'S READINGS: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14 or Revelation 12:7-12a; John 1:47-51 (647). "Amen, amen, I say to you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."

Get to know the word

If you are a fan of scripture, then right next to your Bible should be *The Jerome Biblical Commentary*. The 2,000-plus-page book is a treasure trove of insight about the Bible written by Roman Catholic scholars from across the globe. It is a great resource for helping people to engage more deeply with scripture through study and reflection. The book is named after Saint Jerome, who is best known for his biblical commentaries and translations. Jerome believed that "Ignorance of scripture is ignorance of Christ." It's never too late to increase your knowledge. What would be the first scripture passage you'd look up if you had the book in hand? Why?

In loving color

Though she only lived 24 brief years, Thérèse of Lisieux, the "little flower," was so spiritually mature she was asked to guide novices who were entering her Carmelite order. She used vivid metaphors, comparing the Trinity to a kaleidoscope because the three mirrors transform simple images into colorful designs. She wrote: "As long as our actions, even the smallest, do not fall away from the focus of Divine Love, the Holy Trinity, symbolized by the three mirrors, allows them to reflect wonderful beauty. Jesus . . . always sees beauty in everything we do."


