At Mass this weekend, we are presented with Saint John the Baptist who is the precursor of the Lord. There are a couple of things we learn about him from the gospel which is proclaimed for us today. First, he wore clothing “made of camel’s hair.” (Matt 3:4) It wasn’t exactly a fashion statement, believe me. His words were not exactly warm and inviting. He called the Pharisees and Sadducees a “brood of vipers!” (Matt 3:7) when they came to him for baptism. Even his diet of locusts and wild honey (cf. Matt 3:4) was too much for his contemporaries.

We are left to inquire, who would want to listen to such a fellow? It turns out not a few people. The evangelist tells us in his text that the “whole region around the Jordan were going out to him . . . as they acknowledged their sins.” (Matt 3:5)

Yes, acknowledging their sins. While Advent is not only about sin, there is no way of getting around the stubborn truth that sin does hold us back. It holds us back from recognizing the One Whom John heralded at the Jordan. For his was a baptism there of repentance. (cf. Matt 3:11)

As we make our way through the Advent season, we are waiting for the arrival of our Infant Savior. We pay attention to Saint John the Baptist because he knew of which he spoke. He was unafraid to say, for example, “the one who is coming after me is mightier than I.” (Matt 3:11) And if John was not worthy to carry the sandals of the one coming after him (cf. Matt 3:11), what does that say about us?

It says that we are sinners. And to be free of our sins, we have need of someone who will prod our consciences and be that catalyst who spurs us to ask God for His forgiveness. We need Saint John the Baptist therefore as much as his first century peers did. We have to hear the words spoken long ago by the Lord’s cousin: “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!” (Matt 3:2) We are better for hearing these words. And blessed will we be for acting on them!

Don’t miss our celebration of the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Thursday, December 8<sup>th</sup>**. It is a **Holy Day of Obligation**. Masses are at 9:00 AM and at 7:00 PM.

Two weeks from the Second Sunday of Advent (on **December 18<sup>th</sup>**) is our annual **Lessons and Carols** at 4:00 PM in the church. All are cordially invited to join us. Kindly make the effort to be with us, and then join us immediately afterwards for a reception in the auditorium.

I ask you to place on your calendar the following dates for 2023: February 27, March 6, March 13, March 20, and March 27. Our chief Lenten practice next year will focus on the Holy Eucharist and the foregoing dates will give us an opportunity to deepen the **Eucharistic Revival** occurring in our midst. We will gather on Monday nights during Lent to reflect on the following themes: **The Eucharist in the First Thousand Years, The Eucharist in the Second Thousand Years, The Eucharist in Literature and Music, The Eucharist in Art and Architecture and The Eucharist in the Post-Conciliar Period**. Succeeding bulletins will offer more details. Stay tuned.

Remember that Saint Margaret offers periods of **Eucharistic Adoration** regularly throughout the year. On the First Thursday of the month in the afternoon beginning at 3:00 PM and seasonally (Advent, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time) in the evening starting at 7:00 PM. Join us to pray in the Presence of Christ Who sustains us in all the days and seasons of our lives.

As we continue to make our way through Advent, I invite you to give consideration to the **Sacrament of Penance**. Advent is an especially appropriate time to go to confession. Recall that a priest is available to celebrate the sacrament with you on Saturday afternoons at the 4:00 o’clock hour. It is a good way to prepare for Christmas and experience the grace and mercy of the Lord. Even if your sacramental confession is not in immediate preparation for Christmas, **confessions of devotion** are always salutary and good for the soul.


Continue to observe the holy season of Advent with prayer and the works of mercy.



## Oplatek – A Polish Christmas Tradition



One of the highlights of Christmas festivities in Poland is the Oplatek (pronounced "o-PWAA-tek"). The Oplatek is a decorated Christmas wafer, similar to a large white host. Each person receives one, and then invites the others gathered to break a piece off and eat it. While they are breaking one another's oplatek, people exchange wishes for a blessed Christmas and good health and prosperity. After all those present have broken and shared the Oplatek, good food and Christmas car-ols (in Polish and English) are enjoyed.

This year, members of our Polish community will gather for a traditional Oplatek celebration, and they invite all parishioners to join them in this beautiful tradition.

We will meet in the auditorium on Saturday, **December 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM**. If you would like to come, we ask you to do few things: (1) number of people coming & (2) plan on bringing a traditional Christmas dish that can be shared at the potluck meal, (3) consider a monetary donation (\$25 per family) to cover the costs and church offering. 
