

On the verge of a new month, we continue making our way through the Easter season. As we mark the Fourth Sunday of Easter today, we are led by the Holy Spirit to imitate the apostles, especially Saints Peter and Paul, whose bold witness to the Resurrection of the Lord fills the Church with hope.

We keep in mind the following calendar items:

We celebrate the 75th Anniversary of Saint Margaret on Sunday, June 11th which is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. Mass on that day will be at 11:00 AM (there is no 10:00 AM Mass and no 12 noon Mass that day). Immediately following the 11:00 Mass, there is an outdoor Procession with the Blessed Sacrament and a Reception on the grounds of the church. The members of the 75th Anniversary Committee continue to be available in the vestibule of the church before and after all weekend Masses to accept your reservation. All parishioners are cordially invited. We especially wish to see those parishioners who are active in liturgical ministries and apostolates at the 11:00 AM Mass. They will renew their commitment to service at Saint Margaret on that occasion.

We have **First Holy Communion Masses** on the second Saturday of May (the 13th) at 11:30 AM and 1:30 PM. We are happy to have children of our parish receive Jesus in Holy Communion for the first time because the Lord is pleased with this milestone in the Catholic faith. The special attire of blue suits and white dresses reminds us once again of our own First Holy Communions – however many years ago they were. We remind the parents of this year's Class of First Communicants to take their sons and daughters to Holy Mass **every Sunday in accord with God's law and the Church's precept.** We don't come to love what we should love unless there is a habit formed.

The second Sunday of May (the 14th) is Mother's Day. A great way to remember your mother is to enroll her in our Novena of Masses at Saint Margaret. Envelopes for this purpose have been mailed to envelope-using parishioners. Additional envelopes are available in the church for those who don't regularly use envelopes.

On Mother's Day, we honor the Mother of all of us – the Blessed Mother, the biological Mother of Jesus and our spiritual Mother. Join us after the 12 noon Mass on May 14th to crown the statue of Our Lady on the grounds of our parish. We call upon the parents of our First Holy Communicants to bring their sons and daughter to the 12 noon Mass and lead our procession to the grotto. During that procession, we will sing Marian hymns.

Forty days after Easter, the Church in this part of the United States marks Ascension Thursday. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses on May 18th are offered at 9:00 AM and 7:30 PM.

We continue our catechesis with **adult Catholics** who have not celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation. Sessions are held on Monday nights, which lead to the conferral of the Sacrament on Sunday, May 28th at the 12 noon Mass. That Sunday is when the Church this year observes the **Solemnity of Pentecost.**

As for other matters of recent note:

It was good to see so many parishioners view the **Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit which came to Saint Margaret last weekend.** We had the Exhibit here as a way of heightening awareness to the **Eucharistic Revival** underway in the United States. Clearly evident was the recollection and reverence as parishioners read the panels of Eucharistic miracles from all over the world and from every historical period. Let us resolve to show that same recollection and reverence in the Presence of the Lord always.

We thank those lectors who attended the session on April 19th in the church to be taped while proclaiming the Word of God. We will make those tapes available to the **individual lectors next month.** Please watch the bulletin for when that will be.

Lectors who missed the April 19th meeting are asked to attend an as yet unscheduled session In June before schools close for the summer recess. Watch the bulletin for the date and time.

Tuesday, May 02, 2023

Everything everywhere all the time

Thank Saint Athanasius upon reciting the word "consubstantial"—which used to be "one in being with the Father"—the next time you say the Nicene Creed. Athanasius, as deacon, did the theological homework for his bishop, Saint Alexander I, at the Council of Nicea. Together they resisted Arianism. Prior to the council, the central idea of Arianism had been slowly gaining traction among church leaders: that Jesus wasn't God, wasn't co-equal and coeternal with the Father as taught by the Christian doctrine of the Trinity. As Athanasius insisted of Jesus and the Incarnation, "there is no part of creation deprived of his presence; together with his Father, he fills everything, everywhere, at all times."

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 11:19-26; John 10:22-30 (280). "The Father and I are one."

Wednesday, May 03, 2023

What remains is the legacy

Today the church celebrates the feast of two of the 12 apostles, Philip and James, a peculiar pair of martyrs not otherwise associated with one another in Christian history or tradition. James (also called James the Less) is regarded as the first Bishop of Jerusalem, while Philip was said to have preached in Greece,

Turkey, and Syria. The pairing of their feast days is related to their shared reliquary in the Church of the Twelve Apostles, following a secret move from the Roman Catacombs. Thereafter lost to history for some time, their relics were rediscovered in the church crypt in the 19th century. On this holy feast, let's all remember the sacrifices of the church's first teachers and model their lives of holiness and faith.

We are a people with a history

When asked to speak at a gathering of the Jewish community in the early days of the church, Paul gives a history lesson. He recounts the liberating activity of God throughout Jewish history and ties God's activity directly to the arrival of Jesus the Messiah and the opening of salvation to all humanity. Our God is the God of history, and our human stories—personal and collective—are part of a much larger historical project of salvation. Play your part in the drama.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 13:13-25; John 13:16-20 (282). "Fellow children of Israel and you others who are God-fearing, listen. The God of this people Israel chose our ancestors."

Friday, May 05, 2023

Witness this

Saints and martyrs are the shining lights when it comes to witnessing to Jesus the Christ, often giving their whole lives and their very lives to communicate God's great love. We too are called to be witnesses. "But I'm no saint!" one might protest. "I can't witness like that." You don't have to be! Pope Francis reminds us that "God guides history through the humble courage of those who pray, love, and forgive. There are so many hidden saints, saints who are next-door, hidden witnesses of life, who with little acts of love change history." Next time in prayer, ask God how you've been a hidden witness of God's great love.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 13:26-33; John 14:1-6 (283). "These are now his witnesses before the people. We ourselves are proclaiming this good news to you."

Saturday, May 06, 2023

Choose your destination

Can someone really be destined, or "predestined," for eternal life? According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, our destiny as beings created by God is eternal life. But because we are free, we can choose to opt out of that destiny. Just like the people invited to the wedding feast in the Lord's parable, we can decide not to come or simply fail to show up. Just so, when we choose to live in hate rather than love, in violence rather than peace, in punishment rather than forgiveness, we're choosing another destiny. The choice is ours to make.
