Next Sunday, October 1<sup>st</sup>, is Respect Life Sunday, an annual observance. I invite you to take part in **Stand Up for Life** being held on Route 110 in Melville from 2:00 PM to 3:30 PM. It is a mostly silent, prayerful public witness.

I have been a participant for many years, going all the way back to when it was known as the **Life Chain.** Join with other prolife Long Islanders in protecting children in the womb and help to build a culture of life in our nation.

As I have stated in other columns before this one, there is a scheduled Day of Recollection in conjunction with the **Eucharistic Revival** at Saint Margaret. The date is Saturday, November 18<sup>th</sup>. The speaker is Fr. Roger Landry, a designated preacher on the **Eucharistic Revival** in our country. He is currently the Chaplain at Columbia University in New York City.

I have spoken to the daily Mass-goers about this event on our schedule and our lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion too. I have mentioned that I am concerned about attendance. To make it worthwhile for all parties concerned (the speaker and those who are going to attend), I want to make sure that there is a congregation to hear the preaching on the Holy Eucharist. We need to have at least 50 people in attendance. What I am really looking for is between 50 and 75 persons to participate.

I am asking those who are interested in attending to let me know and, most importantly, tell others about the Day of Recollection and persuade them to attend with you. If it looks like we don't have at least 50 people, I will have to cancel the event. Please kindly let me know before Columbus Day (October 9<sup>th</sup>). I need to let the preacher know the next day if the event will indeed be held.

Advertising for journal ads in connection with our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary has been going on for several weeks now. I encourage parishioners to take an ad. Kindly fill out the form you find in the bulletin and submit it to the pastoral center as soon as possible. The deadline for submissions is rapidly approaching.

Tickets for the luncheon on Sunday, November 19th will be available in the vestibule of the church before and after weekend Masses and at the pastoral center during regular business hours. Reservations will be accepted starting October 14<sup>th</sup>. Tickets are \$70.00 per person.

We close out the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with a Mass on Sunday, November 19<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 AM. Please note the different time. There will **not** be a Mass at 10:00 AM and **not** at 12:00 PM on that day. The first Mass on that Sunday is at the usual time of 8:00 AM.

I ask the parents of children enrolled in **Faith Formation** to attend with your children **Twenty Minutes with the Director/Pastor** according to the schedule which has been drawn up. We continue to stress the linkage between catechesis and worship in our Catholic faith. We learn about and worship the same God in the Church founded by Jesus before His ascension to the Father's right hand in glory. Please attend the sessions on time.

We continue to form our students who come to us for religious instruction in and around the Holy Eucharist. We emphasize developing a love for the Holy Eucharist by cultivating certain habits like genuflecting. I ask all parishioners in accord with the **Eucharistic Revival** to resume using genuflections as a way of acknowledging the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. If you are prevented from doing so for physical reasons, please use a bow of your head when entering and leaving pews or crossing in front of the tabernacle. All of us are teachers when it comes to the Holy Eucharist – priests, deacons, parents, grandparents, peers, etc. Let us all teach that Christ's promise to be with us for all eternity is fulfilled splendidly in the Eucharist.

Please look at the bulletin boards in the church for notices about what is going on at Saint Margaret and elsewhere in the Catholic world. Take a few moments to read and become acquainted with materials calling attention to Holy Hours, Catholic high school open houses, articles appearing in the Catholic press, etc.

### Seamless unity

We work best when we work together. A society pulling in opposite directions tears itself apart. The final prayer Jesus offers at the Last Supper is for unity among his friends. Saint Paul likewise implores his communities to be of one heart. Today, on Respect Life Sunday, we soberly confess that we can't both honor the sacred gift of life and allow poverty, injustice, exclusion, and indifference to remain unchallenged. Coincidentally, it's the International Day of Older Persons, in a world where people over 60 outnumber children under 5. Make this world a welcome place for everyone.

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME TODAY'S READINGS: Ezekiel 18:25-28; Philippians 2:1-11; Matthew 21:28-32 (136). "Complete my joy by being of the same mind, with the same love, united in heart, thinking one thing."

### Monday, Oct 02, 2023

### Watching over us

What exactly does the church teach about angels? "The existence of the spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls 'angels' is a truth of faith," says the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The church venerates angels as servants and messengers of God. And one is particularly looking out for you. But, as Pope Francis says, not just to protect but to prod: "The angels help us; they push us to continue on the journey [of life]." These pure spirits who are in communication with God encourage us to "be not afraid" and take risks. Join the church in welcoming these—and your—special guardians.

### Tuesday, Oct 03, 2023

### The Lord loves justice

Mother Theodore Guerin, whose feast is today, was a missionary to the United States who established schools, a pharmacy, and orphanages. But her love of Christ made her denounce injustices, too. She described a slave auction: "These Americans, so proud of their liberty, thus make game of the liberty of others. Poor negroes! I would have wished to buy them all that I might say to them, 'Go! Bless Providence. You are free!" Her mission continues today with her Sisters of Providence of Saint Mary-of-the-Woods, who strive for peace and justice, particularly in the area of racial equality and equity, criminal justice reform, human trafficking, and immigration. Take to heart Mother Guerin's words as you work to transform the world: "Above all things; justice, justice. If any preference may be shown let it be to the poorest or most abandoned."

TODAY'S READINGS: Zechariah 8:20-23; Luke 9:51-56 (456). "Every nationality, speaking different tongues, shall . . . say, 'Let us go with you, for we have heard that God is with you."

### Wednesday, Oct 04, 2023

#### Make mercy your song to all creation

The feast of Saint Francis of Assisi is a great date to reflect on one's care for creation, as we are often wont to think all that matters in the spiritual life is our connection to God and other humans. The great Franciscan founder showed us by his life, including preaching to the creatures of the air and the field, that all of creation is listening to hear what we have to say. Is our

message that of compassion and prudence, or rather convenience and the "throwaway culture"? Perhaps God himself is choosing to lend an ear by means of all God's creatures, great and small.

### Mercy prevails

Saint Faustina Kowalska is one of a long list of saints who held low status but whose intense relationship with God fueled a power that gained attention. A peasant who became a nun assigned low-level jobs, Faustina's mystical visions of Jesus—at first doubted by church authorities—eventually were embraced widely. They are the foundation of Divine Mercy Sunday, characterized by an image of Jesus with rays of mercy emanating from his heart. Faustina's focus on God's mercy is a message that helped her native Poland through harrowing years of war and repressive government, and it continues to inspire. Commit yourself to an act of mercy today.

MEMORIAL OF FAUSTINA KOWALSKA, RELIGIOUS TODAY'S READINGS: Nehemiah 8:1-4a, 5-6, 7b-12; Luke 10:1-12 (458). "Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household."

### Friday, Oct 06, 2023

### Leading indicators

The stories of the founders of religious institutes most often begin with reluctant souls who feel unworthy to accept such an important task. But, luckily for the church and all blessed by their service and legacy, they eventually take up the mantle of leadership. The decision is not without its benefits, according to Saint Bruno, founder of the Carthusians: "God gives his athletes the reward they desire: a peace that the world does not know and joy in the Holy Spirit." And, for Blessed Marie Rose Durocher, founder of the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary, prayer is key to finding the answers you seek when unsure of next steps: "I suggest that you pray to Our Lord that He assist you and give you the direction you need." Gain strength from the witness of these two great leaders.

Today's celebration has seen a lot of changes over the centuries. It started out as the Feast of Our Lady of Victory to commemorate the Christian defeat of the Turkish army on this date in 1571. A few years later Pope Gregory XIII changed the name to the Feast of the Holy Rosary. Pope Clement XI in 1716 changed the date to August 5. Pius X changed it back to October 7. John XXIII changed the name to the Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary of the Rosary. Then Paul VI changed the name to Our Lady of the Rosary. However you name it, today's Joyful Mysteries invite you to celebrate Christ in your life.
