

Lent began just a few days ago. Today is the First Sunday of Lent. And the gospel has Jesus today in the desert. Tempted by Satan, the Lord never succumbs. He is faithful everlastingly. His example is exactly what we need in our struggle to be faithful. For when we fail to be faithful, we need also to hear the words of Jesus which we heard on Ash Wednesday, and hear again in today's gospel: "Repent, and believe in the gospel." (Mk 1:15)

I want to repeat a few things from last week which are very pertinent to our Lenten observance. At the top of the list is our **Monday night series** of **Holy Hours**. They begin on Monday the 19<sup>th</sup> of February. The time is from 7:30 until 8:30 PM. As we always do, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the tabernacle on the altar. This affords a great opportunity for us to pray personally before the Eucharistic Lord. Come then for this reason. We also have the proclamation of Scripture in the pulpit and commentary from our priests on topics related to the Holy Eucharist. Come then for this reason. There is Benediction too. Come then for this devotion.

I appeal especially to our catechists, our lectors and our extraordinary ministers to attend the Holy Hours. As I stated before, we need to take care that we cultivate an interior life as Catholics. Our faith is never just what we do; it is always a matter of the heart, the mind and the soul. As Saint Paul writes in the New Testament, we must "have [in ourselves] the same attitude that is in Christ." (Phil 2:5) That will not happen unless we are in communion with the Lord. To our catechists, our lectors and our extraordinary ministers, I ask that you join with us in this prayer.

Another important topic is the schedule we have for **Holy Week**. Specifically, I am referring to the liturgies of the **Sacred Triduum** (that being Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday). With these three days, there are three liturgies which are only celebrated once per year. We have assignments (priests, deacons, lectors, servers, etc.) for the Triduum. It is **very important** that we have rehearsals in advance of these public acts of prayer. Next week, these **rehearsals** will be noted in this bulletin (date and time). The priest-celebrant is the leader and he runs the rehearsal. I say this here in this space so that there is no doubt going forward: deacons, servers and lectors are **required to attend the rehearsals for which they are assigned. If you do not attend the rehearsal, you will not serve at the liturgy.** 

We have **Stations of the Cross** every Friday in Lent at 12 noon. I ask all parishioners to give consideration to praying with us every week of Lent as we trace the steps of Jesus as He carried out the great act of loving us to the end.

I invite all parishioners to take some time on a **Saturday afternoon** between 4:00 PM and 4:45 PM to pray with us in church before the exposed **Blessed Sacrament**. This is especially convenient for those who attend the 5:00 PM Mass on Saturdays. It is also convenient for those who are going to Confession. But even if you are not going to Mass or to Confession, please take up my invitation to be with Our Lord Who dwells with us always if only for a few minutes. It is a good way to respond to the **Eucharistic Revival** underway in our nation. Catholics who are committed to the Holy Eucharist are the best Catholics to evangelize fellow Catholics, especially those who have stopped practicing the Faith.

We also have an obligation to give good witness and good example to Catholics who still practice the Faith. Wherever two or three are gathered in the name of Christ, there is He in their midst. But just think of the power there is in the Presence of Christ. Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament is not just using the name of the Lord. It is Christ Himself to whom we are speaking in the most profound way known to us on earth when we set our very eyes on Him in the monstrance. Try to develop the habit of seeking and seeing the One Who made possible for us the glory of the Resurrection by falling to your knees and entrusting yourself to Him.

Blessings to all for a good Lenten journey.




