



As we move toward the end of the Lenten season (today is the Fifth Sunday and a week from today we start Holy Week), we have yet another passage from Saint John's Gospel. It concerns, partially, the matter of Jesus' "hour." The Lord is not yet there but He is getting closer. The "hour" is the glorification of the Son on the Cross. What leads up to that "hour" is of course Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem – the city of the prophets. The prophets who preceded the King of Kings preached repentance with their mouths and their speech. Jesus did the most eloquent preaching of His ministry by dying for us. As Saint John says in the Gospel bearing his name, "God so loved the world that he gave us his only Son." (Jn 3:16) The "giving" was first in the Incarnation, and then in the Paschal Mystery. That "giving" of Jesus in His dying and rising knows no equal in history. No one else in history had risen from the dead. Yet His Resurrection was but first fruits. We follow Him to the grave, and we rise too.

Again, though, it's just the Fifth Sunday of Lent. Let us continue to hold fast to the word of the Lord before His death on Calvary. In today's second reading, the sacred author writes that Jesus "offered prayers and supplications." (Heb 5:7) May our prayers and supplications contribute to our righteous justification as we come before the throne of mercy.

As you may have seen since early in this calendar year, work was being done on the roof of the pastoral center building here on our campus. It took more than three weeks for Preferred Exteriors of New Hyde Park to complete a **roof replacement**. It had become necessary, the roof replacement, that is, after severe downpours of rain in the autumn of last year brought gushing water into the building's interior through the ceiling in several places. When all was said and done, the cost came in at **\$120,000.00**. As I always say, support your parish **generously** and **sacrificially**.

I also say: join us for **Holy Hours** on the Monday nights of Lent and join us for **Stations of the Cross**. Our last Monday night Holy Hour is March 18th beginning at 7:30 PM. We pray the Stations at 12 noon on Friday the 22nd for the last time this Lenten season.

Please see the display in the vestibule of the church for the sign-up for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Holy Thursday night. The church is open till midnight on March 28th. There are three hours indicated on the sign-up. We are asking you to pray for ONE HOUR after the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper.

The last Monday of this month, the 25th, is ordinarily the Solemnity of the Annunciation. This year, it is transferred to April 8th because Monday the 25th of March is Monday of Holy Week. And on Monday of Holy Week, for many, many years, we have had what is known as **Reconciliation Monday, wherein priests are available to hear confessions for several hours in the afternoon and evening. Please see the schedule on the church bulletin boards for the hours you can go to sacramental confession.**

On Reconciliation Monday, there will be copies of **examinations of conscience in the church.** These are offered to assist penitents **before** they go to sacramental confession. Please avail yourself of these to help you make a good and integral confession.

As the weekly bulletin has indicated for weeks now, Catholic adults (over the age of 18) who never celebrated the **Sacrament of Confirmation** may do so on May 19th this year. On May 19th, we celebrate the **Solemnity of Pentecost**. At the 12 noon Mass that day, adults will be confirmed following a period of catechesis starting on Monday the 8th of April. For those interested, please call the pastoral center during regular business hours and let us know that you will be participating.

As this bulletin has indicated before, late in May – on Sunday the 26^{th} – we are having a Communion Breakfast. It starts with the 10:00 AM Mass and continues with Breakfast in the auditorium. On the first two weekends of May, there will be a sign-up in the church vestibule for the Breakfast.

Please see the schedule for Holy Week at Saint Margaret. It lists the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum and also includes Morning Prayer on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Please note the time for Morning Prayer each of those days. It is 8:30 AM. We invite all of our parishioners to join us as we use the Church's prayer to start the day. Obviously, the daily Masses at 9:00 AM are not held for the Triduum.

The day after Easter – Easter Monday as it is called – resumes our daily Masses at 9:00 AM. Until the next time.


Food Pantry Needs
