

Today the Church opens Holy Week with our observance of **Palm Sunday**. The name Palm Sunday derives from the palm branches placed on the ground for Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem before His Passion and Resurrection. The liturgy we celebrate today is a commemoration of the saving acts of Our Lord Who laid down His life for us on Calvary and then was raised up in glory on Easter.

I wish to emphasize that Holy Week makes a claim on each one of us to remember yes, but even more important than remembering is to participate in the rites which bring us into deeper union with Christ Who brought about our salvation by adhering faithfully to the Father's will.

As for the Mass offered today, the first day of Holy Week, it is longer than usual and puts a sharp focus on what the Lord did to save us from sin and death. I recommend then that you use the Gospel of the Passion, today's text, as an aid to your personal prayer, realizing that the best and most revealing test of love is suffering. How might I unite my suffering in the daily course of my life to that which Christ endured out of love for me?

On **Monday of Holy Week**, I urge you to avail yourself of the Sacrament of Penance during the hours established for this purpose. A priest is available between the hours of 2:00 and 4:00 PM and again between 6:00 and 9:00 PM. That would be five hours for sacramental confession on what is known as **Reconciliation Monday**. We will have available then for penitents copies of examinations of conscience. You are encouraged to consider using one or more of them before celebrating the sacrament.

A few days later, on **Holy Thursday** at 7:30 PM, we recall the Last Supper which Jesus shared with His apostles in the upper room. It is the beginning of the **Sacred Triduum**. At the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, the liturgy calls us to reflect upon and be attentive to the Holy Eucharist, the ministerial priesthood and fraternal charity. Following the Mass, the church remains open until midnight for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Please see the sign-up board in the vestibule of the church and mark when you will keep vigil for ONE HOUR.

On **Good Friday**, the Church prays the Passion of the Lord at 3:00 PM. The liturgy has three parts: the proclaimed biblical readings, the veneration of the Cross, and the reception of Holy Communion. In the evening, we have Stations of the Cross at 7:30 PM.

The next day, **Holy Saturday**, the Easter Vigil is celebrated at 8:00 PM. While there are no Baptisms or Confirmations this year, we pray the Church throughout the world will continue to behold the light of Christ which dispels the darkness of ignorance and falsehood.

On Holy Saturday afternoon, there will be no Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 4:00 PM. It will resume on April 6th.

I take this opportunity to encourage parishioners to come to the liturgies I just mentioned above, especially the Holy Thursday night Mass and the Liturgy of the Passion in the afternoon of Good Friday. In recent years, attendance at these two liturgies has fallen way off as to become anemic.

The special character of the **Sacred Triduum** has us praying **Morning Prayer** on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. We begin at **8:30 AM** on each of those days. Please join us as we pray the psalms and listen to the biblical readings which the Church's sons and daughters in consecrated life use every day in convents and friaries all over the world.

In addition to the Diocesan Day of Reconciliation on Monday of Holy Week, we also have the **Sacrament of Penance** on Holy Saturday morning starting at 11:00 AM. This time, the period of time for confessions is one hour until 12 noon.

Those who have liturgical roles in the liturgies during the Triduum, and that includes deacons, lectors, servers are reminded that there are rehearsals. It is necessary that they attend the rehearsals at the designated times. See the bulletin boards in church for the dates and times of the rehearsals.

As you know, Good Friday is a day of **universal fast and abstinence** for those between the ages of 14 and 59 years of age. Catholics should limit themselves to one full meal and no eating in between meals on the day we mark Jesus' death.

I want to appeal to your generosity in the **financial support** of our parish at Easter. Please give to Saint Margaret the most generous gift you can this year. We need to keep pace with our expenses which come without fail in every season of the year.

The last **daily Mass** this week is on Wednesday the 27th at 9:00 AM. Following Easter Sunday, daily Mass resumes on Monday, April 1st. As always, please join us for the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on Mondays through Fridays throughout the Easter season.

On the Second Sunday of Easter, that is, on April 7th, we will have the **Divine Mercy** devotion in the church at 3:00 PM. All are invited to join with us.


