

For the Fourth Sunday of Easter, we hear in the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles today, that a miraculous healing took place at Saint Peter's hands. The apostle attributes the healing not to his own power but to Jesus Christ the Nazarene. (Acts 4:12) It is a good opportunity to reflect upon how the Lord's grace is at work in the world, and how we are sometimes the conduit or the vessel by which the Lord's will is effectuated. In other words, we are the instruments of the divine handiwork etched in creation. We are blessed that the Lord has used in this way, and we rejoice with those who have received the Lord's favor through what we might term our agency. We must be careful though that we don't become smug in the service of Christ; as it were, we hold it over those who are not chosen the way we have been chosen. Be on guard against smugness and follow the example of Saint Peter. Defer to Christ Who can heal the soul and the body.

Our annual Crowning of the Blessed Virgin Mary takes place on Mother's Day, that being May 12th this year. Following the 12 noon Mass, we will process to the grotto on our property and a First Holy Communicant will place a wreath on the head of the statue of Our Lady. This is the third time we have had a crowning of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Saint Margaret.

All parishioners are invited to join us in praying and singing in honor of the Mother of Jesus and our Mother, too. If per chance the weather is inclement, we will have the crowning indoors, in the church.

Parents of First Holy Communicants are asked to bring their sons and daughters to the church and be seated in the section designated for them. The First Holy Communicants should be attired the way they were the day before – on May 11th when Jesus came to them sacramentally through the Holy Eucharist.

We are going to have a **Communion Breakfast** on Sunday, May 26th. Parishioners are invited to attend the 10:00 AM Mass in the church and then go downstairs to the auditorium for the Breakfast immediately thereafter. Please plan to get a ticket for yourself and any family members. Tickets are available on the first two weekends in May in the vestibule of the church after all Masses. The price of a ticket is \$10.00 per person.

Tickets for the Breakfast are also available at the pastoral center building during regular business hours, too. Consider, for example, reserving a table for the members of your family. Individual parishioners are most welcome. We will have plenty of tables to accommodate everyone who wants to attend.

On the first Sunday in June (the 2nd), the Church in the United States celebrates the **Solemnity of Corpus Christi.** The principal Mass that day is at 10:00 AM. Following Mass, there will be a **Procession with the Blessed Sacrament using the route we used last year.** And following the **Procession, there will be a light collation (coffee, tea, bagels, etc.) in the church basement.**

In the event of inclement weather, the Procession will be inside the church. Otherwise, our route will start on church property and finish there. In between, there will be walking while singing **behind the Blessed Sacrament** on College Road. The officers of the 6th precinct will be there to guide us and ensure our safety.

We ask all lectors and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and catechists to attend the 10:00 AM Mass on June 2nd. There will be a pledge of commitment during that Mass on the part of all the lectors, extraordinary ministers and catechists. So, please make a point of being with us. For now, it suffices to circle the date on your calendar. The event (Mass and Procession) is being held to underscore the centrality of the Holy Eucharist to our Catholic identity. In conjunction with the Eucharistic Revival, we make it plain for all to understand that the Lord's Presence which is Real and True is our greatest gift from the God Who died for us on the Cross and rose from the dead on Easter Sunday, thereby showing us the Way to Heaven.

We will celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi this way every year from now on.

The last reminder concerns **a meeting for all lectors** on Tuesday, May 14th at 7:00 PM in the church. Tom Piderit and Msgr. Batule are the speakers. The meeting concludes at 8:00 PM. If per chance a lector cannot attend, he or she must let Tom know in advance. Attendance at the meeting will be taken. Thank you for your cooperation.

We continue to witness to the Risen Lord all the way up through the **Solemnity of Pentecost**. Please consider joining us at daily Mass in thanksgiving for the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit Who makes possible our fidelity to the Author of Life in word and deed.


Heart of the Island Council Knights of Columbus

April 8, 2024 The Annunciation of the Lord

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

We know that the challenges of an unplanned pregnancy can seem insurmountable. This is especially true when it feels like there is no support for a pregnant woman struggling to appreciate the precious gift of life she carries and may compel her towards a regrettable decision. But genuine empowerment of women comes only through recognizing the dignity of the human person at every stage of life and this is most poignantly illuminated through the blessings of motherhood.

In this, it is with great joy that I announce the **FIAT Pregnancy Support Program** at Catholic Health. This program, in partnership with the Diocese of Rockville Centre, comprises a dedicated help line designed to assist women access the **counsel**, **resources**, **and encouragement needed to choose life** when facing a pregnancy with unexpected or difficult circumstances. **The Pregnancy Support Team is available 24x7**, **365 days of the year** to assist callers in accessing the services needed to help them see that every new life is a blessing, even when there are challenges.

Any expectant woman in need of help can call the FIAT Pregnancy Support Program and be confident that, **regardless of age, religion, immigration status or ability to pay**, she will receive compassionate, non-judgmental, and *life-affirming* care. Most of all, she can be assured that she will not be alone through her pregnancy, and she will not be abandoned after she delivers her child. If she is overwhelmed by an unexpected pregnancy, contemplating abortion pills on her college campus, distressed with an adverse prenatal diagnosis, experiencing a miscarriage, worried about feeding her child, regretting a past abortion or other pregnancy-related distress, FIAT is there to help her sort things out and get the care she needs. It only takes the courage of a phone call to find real hope: **631-476-LOVE** (**5683**).

It is my prayer that the **FIAT Pregnancy Support Program** be recognized across the Diocese of Rockville Centre as the first step a woman takes when facing challenging circumstances during pregnancy. There are promotional materials available at every parish and on-line, but we ask for your help to make this resource known widely through your prayers, your witness, and your word-of-mouth, for every one of us has an important and serious responsibility to spread the Gospel of Life. Let FIAT lead the way.
