

I intended to write first today on the Solemnity of Pentecost. But I will save my remarks on the coming of the Holy Spirit to the apostles until later in this column. I want to address up-front an incident that was brought to my attention on Monday the 13<sup>th</sup>. For on that day, after the 9:00AM Mass, an observant parishioner who attended the Mass, brought to me in the sacristy what she found in one of the pews. She brought to me the Host.

Let me say first that we don't know precisely how the Host wound up in one of the pews, except that I am convinced it was consecrated at Mass by a priest (myself or Fr. Patrick) and was given to a communicant. Regarding the identity of that communicant, I can say I don't have a clue. We did have two First Holy Communion Masses on Saturday the 11<sup>th</sup>, and then we had the usual four weekend Masses on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>. But I am not focused on who did this with the Blessed Sacrament; I am more interested in the act of not consuming the Holy Eucharist and leaving the Lord's Body in a pew. We call this act and acts like it a desecration. Communicants are always grievously wrong to take the Blessed Sacrament and not consume it **immediately**. To leave the Blessed Sacrament in the pew (where, fortunately, it was recovered) is deeply offensive to our Catholic Faith, and our reaction should be one of sadness for the desecration itself and for the one who committed this violation.

I ask parishioners to endeavor to make reparation for this grave abuse. By that I mean, we undergo some mortification (freely chosen, of course) for the insult to the Eucharistic Mystery under the very roof where the Lord Himself dwells. Perhaps you could attend Eucharistic Adoration – some part off it, anyway – on a Saturday afternoon before the 5:00PM Mass.

I will comment on another occasion about showing proper respect for the Blessed Sacrament. Perhaps I will do this around the Solemnity of Corpus Christi which comes in two weeks according to the liturgical calendar.

Next Sunday, the 26<sup>th</sup>, we have our Communion Breakfast. The Mass is at the regularly scheduled time of 10:00AM and the Breakfast follows immediately in the church basement. This weekend, the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>, we will sell tickets for the last time in advance. Anyone who shows up for the Breakfast without a ticket can purchase one on the spot next Sunday.

On the first Sunday of June, the 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. Our principal Mass is at 10:00AM. Following the Mass, we will process with the Blessed Sacrament outdoors, on and off the property, and, finally, return to the church for Benediction. A light collation will follow in the church basement.

Lectors, extraordinary ministers, and catechists are to attend the 10:00 AM Mass when they will pledge a re-commitment to liturgical ministry or apostolate. A sign-in will be held for these same lectors, extraordinary ministers and catechists. Don't forget to sign-in.

As I indicated atop this column, I want to offer some remarks on Pentecost before finishing up the space.

During the Easter season, I have reflected periodically at daily Mass about the need for courage in our witness to Christ and the Church. Obviously, the source of that courage is the Holy Spirit. Rather than be timid and frightened in the face of difficulties, we face up to the difficulties and overcome them, yes, I said overcome them. It is exactly as Jesus said in the Farewell Discourse at the Last Supper "In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world." (Jn 16:33) The world can't be conquered (in a spiritual sense) without the virtue of courage.

A faith without courage is not really faith at all. Being tepid and unconvincing; it's completely inadequate to the very real challenges before us in the world. Courageous missionaries throughout the history of the Church have set a high standard for us. We are right at this moment in history, in modernity, to wonder if we have it within us to face down the enemies of suffering and death as those courageous missionaries did before us. In a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday today, we ask to be made vessels of a redoubtable courage. Come, Holy spirit, fill us with the grace to resist all that would wear down courage.


# Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament


The church is open at 8:30 AM Monday through Friday. We encourage

Bible Study group meets every Wednesday from 10am to 11am in the parish center. Deacon Ed Hayes will be the


