Last week, at the end of my column, I referred to **Saints Thomas More** and **Saint John Fisher**, English martyrs in the sixteenth century. We honor both of them in the liturgy on June 22nd, the end of this week (Saturday). I wrote about these heroic men because their Memorial is in June, but also because both men were killed at the order of King Henry VIII. The king was once a Catholic, but left the Church because he could not divorce his wife and marry another woman in order to have an heir for the English throne. The King started his own church over this!

The lives of More and Fisher, and their martyrdoms of course, reach across the centuries, inviting us to ponder the validity of the word of God. And here I am referring to the biblical teaching on the indissolubility or permanence of marriage, a teaching by the way which originates with Jesus Himself.

The tendency today in many circles is to trivialize that teaching because it is thought to be too restrictive and no longer "fit" for modernity. Well what would it be like if we were to "relativize" other teachings of Jesus, say, the Lord's teaching on caring for the sick and poor? Who though is brash enough to usurp divine authority and make our own teaching superior to that of the eternal *Logos*? We know the answer to that question, I trust.

There is still more pertinence to the liturgical remembrance of both More and Fisher. And it concerns the matter known as religious freedom. It is the reason why Europeans first came to these shores hundreds of years ago. They came in search of a religious freedom they did not have at home in England. The purpose of government ought not to be the marginalization of religion but to permit the "free exercise thereof." Sadly, the "free exercise thereof" is under threat with case after case surfacing in the news about government's refusal to allow men and women of faith from acting according to right judgments of conscience. The United States is still the "land of the free" but how do we understand freedom? Is it to be construed no longer in relation to the truth but against it now?

Today we mark **Father's Day**. In giving thanks to our earthly fathers, we appeal o our Heavenly Father who gave us the Son in he Spirit. Human fatherhood owes its inspiration then to diving fatherhood. And since our understanding of human fatherhood emerges out of divine fatherhood. It makes sense then that we pray to our Heavenly Father for the men who gave us our start in this world. And what better way to do that than by having your human father remembered in our **Father's Day Novena**?

Parishioners can do just that by filling out the envelope designated for this purpose. The envelope can then be returned to the parish through the collection basket at weekend Mass or by placing it in the box located in the vestibule.

I urge you to view **photographs** from the Communion Breakfast and the Solemnity of Corpus Christi which are on display in the vestibule. These photographs follow the ones from First Holly Communion and the Crowning of the Blessed virgin Mary from last month. They may also be viewed online at our parish website.

I take this opportunity to encourage you to use some time in the summer and dedicate it to some **spiritual formation.** What I have in mind is making a day of recollection on your own, or going on a retreat, or taking up some spiritual reading (a book or a monograph). There used to be a fair amount of this kind of thing in the years gone by, but not so much anymore. Go against the grain, though. You won't regret spending your time this way. Use your time for the timeless. It's a great way to prepare for the timelessness of eternity.

Then, of course, there is always the timeless character of the **Eucharist**. It starts in time – that's for sure. But its purpose is to give us a glimpse of what is timeless.

On this point, I don't want to forget to remind you that every Saturday afternoon but Holy Saturday, we have a **Holy Hour** (abbreviated to 45 minutes because of the 5:00 PM Mass) starting at 4:00 PM. Please remember that we draw our strength from the One Who shared our life in all things but sin. He has not abandoned us just because He ascended to the Father's right hand in glory. He continues to be with us under the veil of bread and wine.

And, lastly, I offer the recommendation that you see *Jesus Thirsts*, the film I mentioned in the pulpit on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. Its initial offering to the public has been extended a few more days this month. Check local listings. You won't want to miss this spectacular film. It is, bar none, the best presentation on Catholicism I have seen in the media in decades! It is truly exceptional!
