I have held for a long time that the summer is an excellent opportunity for adults to follow up on important aspects of personal development that might not be possible when the school schedule dominates the calendar as much as it does. The summer is a time for reading, for investigating things which we scarcely have the time for without vacations and leisure time. With this in mind, I am going to suggest an area of inquiry which can be easily overlooked by Catholics these days. I am referring to what is known as the **sanctoral cycle**. The term pertains to remembering the saints, those holy men and women who help us to live the Catholic life as well as we ought. In the month of July, we remember a good number of these saintly men and women in the Church's liturgy and breviary. I will mention five of them in my column this week.

I start with **Saint Bonaventure** whom we remember on July 15th. He lived in the thirteenth century (d. 1274) and followed the charism of Saint Francis of Assisi, the founder of the Franciscans. He was a Bishop (of Albano) and was a Cardinal too. He authored the work entitled *The Mind's Road to God*, to which I was introduced as a seminarian, and then as a professor I covered in a course on *Faith and Reason*.

Saint Bonaventure is known as the *Seraphic Doctor*. The seraphs are angels. It reminds us that Saint Bonaventure's theological outlook is soaring (in the realm of the angels) but he definitely lived his vocation on earth. Otherwise, he could never have vowed to be poor, chaste and obedient in imitation of the Lord in His earthly ministry. Even if we are not bound by these evangelical counsels ourselves, we still must practice the virtues of simplicity of life, chastity and obedience. Without these virtues, we do not belong to Christ Who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. (cf. Jn 14:6)

A week later, on the 22nd, we honor **Saint Mary Magdalene**. We know her from the ministry of Jesus. All we need do is read the Gospels and see that Mary Magdalene is a witness to the Lord's death and Resurrection. The evangelists do not record Mary Magdalene as saying anything when Jesus dies, but Saint John's Gospel has her saying *Rabboni*, meaning Teacher (cf. Jn 20:16), after the Lord had called her by name.

Not only did she see the Risen Christ then, but she carried word of this to the disciples. She is a witness therefore to the triumph of the Suffering Servant over this valley of tears as the *Memorare* says of life this side of heaven. As we read and hear the Gospel of the Resurrection proclaimed, we ought to draw inspiration from Mary Magdalene's clear and unequivocal identification of the Lord. Bearing witness to the Lord in our speech and behavior is what we ought to be doing all the time.

A few days later, on the 25th, we honor **Saint James, Apostle**. Found in every listing of the apostles in the Gospels, he is a blood brother of anther apostle, John. You might recall that the mother of these two apostles approached Jesus and asked that her sons be given places of honor in Jesus' Kingdom. Not exactly a great moment for Saint James, we should admit. But as we see with another apostle, Peter, there is embarrassment but also vindication for James. For James is the first of the apostles martyred. The apostles are the foundation of the Church, and thus our faith cannot be anything but apostolic. We believe *with* the apostles and never apart from them as the Nicene Creed tells us.

The next saint as we make our way through July returns us to Jesus' own ministry. It is **Saint Martha**. She has a sister, Mary, and a brother, Lazarus. Jesus visited with all three in Bethany. And as Saint John's Gospel indicates, Lazarus died. Martha who had previously attended to the details of hospitality, now in her brother's death confesses her faith in Jesus with these words: "Yes, Lord, I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." (Jn 11:27)

Saint Martha teaches us that serve we must, but believing is the very *raison d'etre* for knowing Jesus. We know Him to believe in Him. That is what faith is all about. We should not over-intellectualize faith. It is in essence knowing the Son, and having the conviction that He is Our Savior.

The last saint is **Saint Ignatius of Loyola** who brings us out of the realm of first-century Palestine and inserts us into sixteenth century Europe. We honor him on the 31st. Ignatius, while recovering from injuries sustained in armed conflict, underwent a conversion and went on to found the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits.

Saint Ignatius is the author of the *Spiritual Exercises* which has guided retreatants over the centuries and gives us lessons in what we call discernment. In the movement of the spirits, there is consolation and desolation. Knowing how to identify these frequently subtle movements in our souls enables the followers of Jesus to deepen union with Him, or to turn away from sin and to seek reconciliation.
