A few days ago, we celebrated the Church's liturgy for the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Many of us are able to recall from our childhood that August 15th was a signal that it wouldn't be long before school re-opened. It was, in a manner of speaking, a time for "last licks." We don't hear that term very much any longer. It's a reference to sports, especially baseball when the home team had its last few at-bats. Unless the game was tied and you went into "extra innings," it was just "three more outs" before the game was over.

We look forward to the longer daylight in June, July and August – sitting in the backyard after dinner, wondering if there is anything on the television to pique your interest, anticipating the next day and what it would bring. Right in front of you of course are things like work, school and other serious pursuits, but you aren't quite there yet. You still have a little time remaining.

In this respect, the Holy Day of Obligation a few days ago is well-placed both in the calendar and in the psyche. We haven't gotten to the end of summer – not yet – but we are moving closer to its end. We have to acknowledge this at a deeper level too. We are getting closer to the end of our lives, our earthly lives, that is. How do we get ready then for that moment when we breathe our last in this world? Is there some plan to follow? Is there someone to guide us to the end?

We say of Our Lady that she was assumed into heaven body and soul. Just as it should be, we aver. We entered into "this world" in just this way: body and soul. What we have been given at the start, we now surrender to the One Who made us, the One Who knit us together in our mother's womb – so says the psalmist (cf. Psalm 139:13). As there is a beginning for each of us, so is there an end too.

If we didn't have "imput" in our beginning, we certainly have had it since. That's what we call development, personal development. Since we are free (not mythically free but really free), our lives have a shape and form. It's undeniable too. The shape and form come from the decisions we have made, the paths we have taken, the commitments into which we have entered.

Thus, it was so for the Blessed Virgin Mary. What, though, if she rejected the angel Gabriel's invitation and did not become the Mother of Our Savior? Everything would be different, wouldn't it? Absolutely.

The Holy Day of Obligation a few days ago reminds us that there is about our lives an *eschatology*. By eschatology, it is meant that last things matter greatly. They matter greatly because they are true. We are going to die, we are going to be subject to judgment, and we will either be in the presence of God for eternity or we will not.

There is considerable reluctance to accept the scenario as I have just described it. God can't be that way, can He?

Ah, but there are such things as commandments, and there is a big difference between beatitude and woe. Heaven and hell are real too. Otherwise, justice and mercy are just capricious and accidental.

Human lives matter. Always and without exception. To abide in this really realist perspective – otherwise known as faith – we need to think and live *eschatologically*. And that, after all, is the meaning in the Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady. That heaven was given to Mary of Nazareth right away is owing to the truth that she was without original and personal sin.


