I have long thought of September as a month of transitions. Characterizing the month in just this way, we think of course that vacations come to an end for the most part, we think further of schools re-opening, daylight getting shorter, and warm days giving way to cooler ones. Taken singly, the aforementioned changes are quite unremarkable in and of themselves. But when they all show up together, it gives rise to a rather significant shift that is pretty hard to miss.

Autumn comes and we say goodbye to sandy beaches except as places for viewing sunsets of brilliant color, maybe even worthy of a framed photograph or two. It isn't just the climate or the weather, either. It is much more than that. It's a return to more pensive pursuits, to planned events that ask us for an RSVP.

As we get acclimated to a new phase of life at home and at the workplace, we take note of two dates this month. The dates are back-to-back, the 14th and 15th, and we know them on the liturgical calendar as the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross and the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. The transition at stake is that of moving from an unpreparedness for death to an acceptance of it. We undergo this transition the only way we can: to find in the life of Christ the strength and the courage to face our own deaths. And it begins with the acknowledgement that there is victory in the Cross. Suffering, yes – for sure, but the Cross is a suffering unto the Resurrection. And as we undergo this suffering, we recall that the One Who triumphed over it commends his own mother (and our mother too) to an apostle who took her into his own home. (cf. Jn 19:27)

To live discipleship as well as we ought, we must follow Our Lady and the apostle into the home of the church where the Lord dwells sacramentally. He is the One Who told us where He could be found even after He ascended to the Father's right hand in glory. With us in lowliness and humility, the Incarnate Lord wants us to share our time with Him, the Author of time. For our time is passing, so much so that our hearts yearn for what we truly cannot give to ourselves – eternity. Only Jesus can grant this gift. It comes to us first in the mystery of the Holy Eucharist.

What follows from this point to the end of my column is a reprise of what I have said in columns of the past few weeks.

Next weekend, the Parish Mission is offered at all weekend Masses. Please see the bulletin boards in the church and the display in the vestibule for any additional information about Al Barbarino.

Twenty Minutes commences this weekend. All students enrolled in Faith Formation are to attend the sessions as required. Don't be late! And follow the schedule which has been drawn up by Jackie Mirenda, our Religious Education Coordinator.

Copies of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* are being distributed to all families who have a child(ren) in the program. We will use the volume at various points during the year. Always keep the book in a place which is readily accessible at home.

We are asking all of our families with children in Faith Formation to support the parish financially every week. We are using envelopes for this purpose. They are going to be distributed on Sunday mornings at Twenty Minutes. We have much, much work to be done on the stewardship of treasure here at Saint Margaret!

In a few weeks, I will make remarks on the financial state of the parish. The bulletin that weekend will have data to which I will refer in my presentation in the pulpit. I ask all parishioners to take an interest in this topic as it figures prominently in what is possible and what is not possible pastorally.
