

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is also known as *Laetare Sunday*. The word *laetare* is from the Latin and it means "rejoice." God's people are exhorted by the prophet Isaiah to "rejoice with Jerusalem." (Is 66:10) The term "rejoice with Jerusalem" is taken from the Introit (entrance verse) for Mass on the Fourth Sunday of Lent.

We recall that Jerusalem is the city of Jesus' suffering and death. What is there however in suffering and death to rejoice about? We can't possibly answer this question without noting the paradox – the great paradox – for it has to do with Jesus' suffering and death. His suffering in the Passion and His death on the Cross obviously brought tears of sorrow and pain. Think here of the women along the *Via Dolorosa* and the disciples who gathered at Calvary on the first Good Friday. But what if Jesus had not undergone suffering and death? Well, it would mean that we could not claim that Jesus saves us then. Our faith would therefore be in vain. Paradoxically, then, there is joy in what Jesus won for us through the paschal mystery, and most importantly of all that by the God-Man's suffering and death, we have the incomparable gift of eternal life.

Laetare Sunday is a reminder in Lent that the Lord's Resurrection is on the horizon, liturgically speaking. Our prayer, our fasting and our alms-giving are not for naught. There is no cheap victory in the Cross. Neither is there an ephemeral joy in the Resurrection.

I now take up matters which are crucial to having a prayerful and reflective Holy Week and Sacred Triduum here at Saint Margaret.

The sign-up for **Adoration on Holy Thursday** night is available in the vestibule. I encourage you to sign up for an hour of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament as we mark the night of the institution of the Holy Eucharist. Some parishioners have already done so and that is commendable. I would like to see all three hours covered with an estimable number of adorers.

As I mentioned in my last column, assignments have been made for Palm Sunday and the Sacred Triduum. There is no rehearsal for any Mass on Palm Sunday. There is however a rehearsal for each of the principal liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Thursday. Assigned deacons, lectors and servers are to attend. Know when the rehearsal is and please be there.

There is no Mass on Holy Thursday morning, and none on Good Friday at any time, and none on Holy Saturday in the morning. We do have **Morning Prayer on each of these three days at 9:00 AM.** I encourage all parishioners who are able to join us.

On April 14th, we have another **Reconciliation Monday.** A priest-confessor is available each hour from 2:00 PM until 4:00 PM and again from 6:00 PM until 9:00 PM. I encourage all parishioners to go to sacramental confession before Easter. We also have two other opportunities for sacramental confession (on Good Friday and Holy Saturday). Please see the bulletin boards in church and consult the Easter mailing which has gone out to parishioners who receive envelopes through the regular mail.

Again, I want to remind mass-goers on Sundays that the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar in the monstrance between 11:15 AM to 11:45 AM. I ask church-goers who attend the 10:00 AM Mass and the 12 noon Mass to take a few minutes after Mass or before Mass to pray before the Eucharistic Lord.

We have two more **Holy Hours** remaining in our Lenten observance – March 31st and April 7th. They start at 7:30 PM. I thank those parishioners who have attended the three we have already had. I mention too that these Holy Hours are intended for everyone. Especially, I would like to see our catechists, extraordinary ministers and lectors at these Holy Hours.

The annual **Chrism Mass** is held on Tuesday, April 15th at 4:00 PM in Saint Agnes Cathedral in Rockville Centre. The priests of our diocese renew their commitment to the priestly vocation during this liturgy. With the distance involved between Selden and Rockville Centre and the difficulty of the time in question, you may want to watch the television coverage on Catholic Faith Network (Channel 29).

I urge all parishioners to continue their Lenten devotions and to make time in your schedules to attend the liturgies which are held from **Holy Thursday through Holy Saturday**. I note with concern that fewer and fewer Catholics attend these liturgies anymore. Our churches used to be full (when I was ordained some forty years ago) but not so now. We are down to a remnant now.

Guidelines for Fasting & Abstinence

All Catholics who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Good Friday.

This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.

Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Good Friday fast and abstinence.
