Please note: due to privacy issues, we can include names given by the individual or a health care proxy only. Thank you. As I did last week, I am offering a brief synopsis in this column of the saints we honor on the liturgical calendar – this time, in the month of August. I start near the beginning of August and I will take us almost until the end of this month.

We honor Saint John Vianney, also known as the Cure' of Ars, on the 4th of August. According to the biographies of this French saint, he struggled enormously with his academic courses in the seminary. Naturally, this cast doubt on whether he would ever be ordained a priest. But he was. And what a priest he turned out to be!

He was assigned as the parish priest (curate, abbreviated as *cure'*) in the village of Ars, an out-of-the way place on the French map. His sanctity became evident before too long because he spent long hours in the confessional, not sitting there alone but reconciling sinners with God Who is rich in mercy. His reputation was such that penitents would come from great distances and wait for hours on line to receive absolution from this holy priest.

A few days later, on the 8th, the Church honors Saint Dominic, another priest. But unlike Saint John Vianney who was a diocesan priest, Saint Dominic was a Religious, that is, he belonged to a Religious Order whose members take vows and live in community. Indeed, he was the founder of the Order of Preachers (O.P.). The Order of Preachers or the Dominicans are dedicated to the practice of contemplation.

The Dominicans do a little parish work but are mostly associated with educational institutions at various levels, especially high schools and colleges and universities. The Dominican Order's most well-known university is in Rome, and it is called the Angelicum (with the angels) which has been the intellectual home of some of the Church's canonized saints, including Pope Saint John Paul II (d. 2005).

The very next day, the 9th, we honor one of the most intriguing saints in the history of the Church: Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross who was first known as Edith Stein. She was born in Germany and to Jewish parents. Having become an agnostic in her early years, she came across the published works of Saint Teresa of Avila, a Carmelite nun. These published works of St. Teresa of Avila were deeply influential in Edith receiving Baptism and converting to Catholicism in 1922.

Following her entrance into the Catholic Church, Edith became a Carmelite nun herself. But this did not prevent the Nazis from tracking her down and putting her into prison at Auschwitz. She was killed there in 1942. During the pontificate of John Paul II, Edith Stein was raised to the altars (that is, she was canonized a saint).

On the 14th, the Church honors Saint Maximillian Kolbe. He too is connected with the Second World War and with Auschwitz. He grew up in Poland where he discerned a vocation to Religious Life and joined the Franciscans. As a priest, he had a great devotion to Our Blessed Mother and promoted that Marian devotion during his priestly ministry. While he was interred in Auschwitz, he volunteered to take the place of a Jewish man who was a husband and father, and had been marked out for immediate death by the Nazis on this one particular occasion.

By offering himself to the Nazis as a substitute for the Jewish husband and father, this priest-martyr demonstrated a selflessness which reminds us of Christ's self-emptying and culminated of course in His death on the Cross.

At the end of the month (on the 28th), we honor Saint Augustine, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. After a period of impulsivity which covered his adolescence and young adulthood, Augustine underwent a profound conversion and dedicated himself to Christ and the Church. He was baptized by Saint Ambrose in the late fourth century and went on to be ordained a priest. After priestly ordination, he was named the Bishop of Hippo in North Africa.

Augustine was an abundantly talented man who preached well, wrote well and founded a Religious Order bearing his name – the Augustinians. He is one of the most quoted figures in religion, and is understood to be one the most decisive figures in the development of Western Civilization. His book entitled *Confessions* (his spiritual autobiography) is read and re-read in many different nations and cultures every year by thousands and thousands of people. It is also required reading at some of the most prestigious universities in the world.

The saints show us the way to Christ throughout all historical epochs. Their witness shines brightly in a rich variety of cultures. In these lazy, hazy days of summer, why not read a biography of one saint who may open up new insights for you about how to follow Christ the Lord now, in your own circumstances.


Our Music Ministry is in need of volunteers to assist in placing the words on our screen during Mass. All that is required is clicking the
