We still have several weeks to go before Labor Day and the unofficial end of summer, but I want to make reference to a number of things in our parish which are being held just as school starts for many students in the month after this one.

Early next month – just after Labor Day – there are **evenings of formation** scheduled for our **parish catechists.** They are being held on Tuesday, September 2nd and Wednesday, September 3rd. On the first night, the speaker is Mr. David Bonagura, and on the second night, the speaker is yours truly. Both evenings start at 7:00 PM and finish at 9:00 PM. The sessions are held in the pastoral center building. All catechists should attend both sessions. If a catechist cannot attend for some reason, she should contact the Pastor in advance.

On Sunday, September 7^{th} , we resume **Twenty Minutes with Pastor/Director** after a summer hiatus. Families with children enrolled in Faith Formation should follow the schedule drawn up for 2025 - 2026.

That second week in September, we have our annual **Holy Hour** for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion on Wednesday the 10th at 7:00 PM in the church. It will be followed by a meeting in the pastoral center building. It will be over by 9:00 PM.

All parishioners are invited to join us for the Holy Hour. And this is true for any Holy Hour we hold at Saint Margaret. Come and join us as we pray in the company of the One Whose Presence fills our hearts with joy and peace.

In October, on the first Sunday of that month (the 5th), there is a **Life Chain** which is being held on Rt. 110 in Melville. It begins at 2:00 PM and finishes at 3:30 PM. I ask you to consider attending. It is a prayerful, mostly silent witness on the eastern side of the street south of Jericho Turnpike.

Next month, please consult the flyers on our bulletin boards announcing the Life Chain. Join with hundreds of Long Islanders in this public witness affirming the sanctity and dignity of human life in the womb.

On that first weekend in October (4th and 5th), we will have a **Baby Bottle Campaign** with speakers from the Life Center before all weekend Masses. Please follow the bulletin after Labor Day for more information. You may remember we had the Baby Bottle Campaign two years ago (2023) in the month of July.

On October 7th, a Tuesday this year, the Church marks the **Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary.** I invite all parishioners to come to the 9:00 AM Mass that day, and then go to the grotto on our property and pray the holy rosary there. I will comment more on this in the weeks to come.

We last had a **Day of Recollection** in November of 2023, on a Saturday. I would like to have another of these. I have invited a priest to lead it and I am awaiting an acceptance of my request. Follow the weekly bulletin for more information after Labor Day.

At the end of this week (August 15th), we celebrate the **Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses are at 9:00 AM and 7:30 PM.

On the 22nd of August, there is another Marian feast in the liturgical cycle for us to commemorate. It is the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Years and years ago, in another part of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, there began a custom of a Marian Procession on August 22nd. I am not sure if the Procession is still held or not, but it does reflect the veneration we ought to have for Our Lady. That Marian piety is what some of us grew up with at home, in our school, and in our neighborhood. Sadly, few Catholic children today have any exposure to things like this.

We have a framed picture of Pope Leo XIV which will go up in our church soon. So, too, will a framed picture of Bishop Barres go up. We are looking to have them both in place about Labor Day.



They provide individuals with essential items such as food, personal care products, household supplies, and more. You may drop items off at the parish center. Thank you!










Bereavement Ministry
