Family members: please resubmit names for those who are ill. We will list them for four weeks, and then remove them unless told otherwise. Please note: due to privacy issues, we can include names given by the individual or a health care proxy only. Thank you. Today, we mark the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The gospel text at Mass includes the verse "God so loved the world that he gave us his only Son." (Jn 3:16) Readers of this column may remember watching sports on television in which fans in the stadiums (usually football stadiums too) would hold signs with the words I cited above. You don't see much of the signs anymore. If they are there, you wouldn't know it because the television cameras don't show the signs. It's too bad we exercise such censorship, self-imposed or not, because biblical verses are not alienating, as some say they are. Why would the God Who made us want to alienate us? Saving us is not alienating us; it is loving us. Indeed, God draws close to us, paradoxically, through the Cross. By that Cross, we have life on high. Sin and death have been overcome. Let us not be embarrassed then, but let us be confident!

Public expressions of faith do make some Americans skittish. We live in a deeply secularized society now, and thus we think by restricting the Cross to certain "safe" places like churches, we won't risk arousing complaints against us. But not even in churches are we safe anymore.

Survivors who suffer in the aftermath of the terrible school shooting at the Annunciation Catholic Parish in Minneapolis and those who died there as a result of its horror in late August, for all of them there is hope. Saint Paul writes in his Letter to the Romans that hope does not disappoint us because it rests with the Son Who loves us to the grave and beyond it. He can do that because He went to the grave Himself for us out of love. And love for Christian believers is eternal because the Resurrection is eternal!

Let me mention some matters now which are related to the calendar for the month of October.

The first Sunday of October is Respect Life Sunday. I encourage parishioners to go to the Life Chain (also known as Stand Up for Life) held on Route 110 in Melville. Participants should go to the east side of Rt. 110, south of Jericho Turnpike for a 2:00 PM start. It concludes at 3:30 PM.

It is a largely silent and prayerful public witness. I have attended for many, many years now. Please consult the bulletin boards in the church for more details. You will also see that Saint Margaret is a sponsor of the event – along with many other parishes and other organizations on Long Island. So, drive over in your car, and join with other pro-life people to stand up for the humans we can't yet see with our eyes - not until they are born.

The first weekend of October (the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>), we have the start of the Baby Bottle Campaign here at Saint Margaret. We last had it in 2023. It begins with brief talks by volunteers before Masses. The speakers are volunteers at the Life Center. As you leave church after Mass, you can pick up from the ushers the baby bottles. At the end of October (24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>), you return the baby bottle with your loose currency and change in it.

As we started the school year, we had Orientation sessions with the families of the children enrolled in our parish Faith Formation program. We continue to emphasize the importance of Twenty Minutes with the Pastor/Director on Sunday mornings before the 10:00 AM Mass. We ask the parents to attend with their child(ren) these catechetical sessions according to the schedule drawn up by Mrs. Jackie Mirenda. The schedule goes almost the entire length of the school year (September – May). Families should bring with them to the sessions their copies of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*.

We have a liturgical observance on October 7th honoring Our Blessed Mother (Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary). I ask parishioners to join us on that day (a Tuesday) after the 9:00 AM Mass at the grotto on parish property to pray in common the holy rosary. We will do this weather permitting, of course.

We resume our socials on Sunday mornings after the 10:00 AM Mass on September 28<sup>th</sup>. The Knights of Heart of the Island Council host the event. Come and join us for some hospitality at the end of this month in the church basement.


Bible Study will resume on Wednesday,


