As we begin another school year, we trace the contours of some events and occurrences here at Saint Margaret for this month and next one.

The Mass Book for 2026 opened just a few days ago. You can remember family members and friends with announced Masses. We accept intentions for all the Masses in our schedule. Nevertheless, please limit a Mass Intention to one person.

On Monday the 8th, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Come and joins us at the 9:00 AM Mass.

A week from today (on the 14th), the Church marks the **Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.** The priest will wear red vestments for the occasion, reminding us of the Blood shed by Our Lord in winning our salvation. Come, let us worship, we say or sing, liturgically.

The next day, the 15th, the Church observes the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows when we recall the Virgin-Mother's love for her dying Son on Calvary. Again, join us at morning Mass.

On Sunday the 21st, the **Life Center** in Massapequa is holding a gala celebration to raise monies for the defense of the unborn. Contact the Life Center to learn more about how you might help mothers bring their children to term.

On the last Sunday of September (the 28th), we resume our **socials** following the 10:00 AM Mass in the auditorium (church basement). The Knights of Columbus (Heart of the Island Council) host the occasion. All parishioners are invited to attend.

On the first weekend in October (the 4th and 5th), we have the start of the **Baby Bottle Campaign** which is run by the Life Center in Massapequa. That weekend, baby bottles will be distributed to parishioners on their way out of church. The baby bottles are returned on the 25th and 26th with your loose change and currency in them. Speakers from the Life Center will make brief presentations on the purpose of the campaign at all Masses.

On Sunday the 5th, there is a **Life Chain** or **Stand Up for Life** on Route 110 in Melville. The event is nearly forty years old. And we invite parishioners to participate in this mostly silent, prayerful witness to the sacredness of human life in the womb. It starts at 2:00 PM and concludes at 3:30 PM. Participants use the east side of Route 110 south of Jericho Turnpike.

The Life Chain or Stand Up for Life is sponsored by the Long Island Coalition for Life every year. Look for the name of our parish on the flyer announcing the event this year.

I encourage parishioners to participate on October 5th. I do every year. Bring a family member or friend and introduce someone new to the pro-life movement.

I raise the issue of **assisted suicide** once again. Both houses of the state legislature approved passage of a bill allowing this gruesome procedure to be done. The only thing missing is the Governor's signature. This is quite unusual since New York State already has a lousy record of protecting vulnerable life (*in utero*). There is still time however to contact the Governor and advise her not to sign. Please do so and right away too.

Back to the liturgical calendar, on the Third Sunday of October (the 19th), we have **Mission Sunday.** It is a reminder that the Church's mission is always at the forefront of her work, namely, that of proclaiming the Gospel to the ends of the earth. We all have roles in that work too. We should know what our own role is and then carry it out as assiduously as we can.

Let us do the Lord's work in the time allotted to us here on earth. This is how time becomes sanctified. Putting our hands to the plough and not looking back is how Jesus puts it in the Gospel.


Saint Margaret's Spousal Bereavement






