

There is a custom that as we begin a new liturgical year, we review some points of church etiquette. And that is what I am going to do with the greater part of this column. The form I am taking with this column is exhortation.

Be on time. It sometimes happens that last minute interruptions get us off schedule right before we walk out the door to go to Mass. In the main, though, that is not the case. As we start this Advent season, please resolve to get to church before Mass starts. And this exhortation pertains to daily Mass as well as it does to Sunday Mass. We want to concentrate on the whole of Mass – from the opening hymn to the closing hymn and all the parts of the Mass in between. It's a matter of respect for the Lord and for our neighbors. Charity comes in all forms, including how we respect the Lord and the time of others when they are at prayer.

Be of one heart and one mind. The celebration of Holy Mass is an act of communal worship. And that means we pray personally within the one Body of Christ. As we belong to the one Body and we are one with the Lord, we also have to make efforts to be of one voice too. When we pray the responses to the prayers of the Mass, we should be praying the same words and at the same pace all the time. Please make that effort so that what we are doctrinally is borne out in how we pray. We pray together, at the same pace.

Eliminate noise. There is a lot of noise in church, and we have to make more efforts and better efforts to be quiet in the Presence of Christ. Vocal prayer is important (at the right times and in the right way) but so is contemplation of the Mystery of God. He dwells with us always in every Catholic church (in the tabernacle). We take that Presence of Christ too much for granted when we talk at liberty right in front of the Blessed Sacrament. There is a time for socializing and it is not in plain sight of the Eucharistic Lord.

The importance of gestures. The Catholic faith makes wide use of signs, and some of these signs we make with our bodies. I am thinking of the genuflection. As I stress often with the children enrolled in Faith Formation, we address the Lord with a genuflection. When age or health issues preclude genuflections, we still can do something to acknowledge the Lord's Presence. A bow of the head intentionally would be most appropriate when you are prevented from making a genuflection.

Honor the integrity of the Mass. In addition to coming on time, being of one heart and mind, eliminating noise and using bodily gestures, we should stay through the entirety of the Mass. We ought not to depart early, "ducking out" before the final hymn is sung.

The Amen at the reception of Holy Communion. More and more communicants are not saying Amen when they receive Holy Communion. I don't know if it's half of the communicants who do not say anything, but it's not an insignificant number who are silent at the point of receiving the Holy Eucharist. Kindly use the word Amen which means Yes, I believe.

On the first weekday of Advent, on Monday, December 1st at 7:00 PM in the church, we are having a Holy Hour. I encourage all parishioners to come and pray with us in front of the Blessed Sacrament. This invitation is also intended for lectors, catechists, and extraordinary minsters of Holy Communion. The Advent season is a time of waiting for the Lord to come. Although the culture at large has gone full bore with Christmas already, we must be different.

We should be seeking holy days in anticipation of the Nativity of the Lord. A great way to do this is to have a contemplative posture, being with the Lord in the proclamation of His Word and in being present to His Presence.

The ushers meet on Tuesday, December 2<sup>nd</sup> at 7:00 PM in the pastoral center building. The meeting should last about forty-five minutes or so.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, a Holy Day of Obligation, is on Monday, December 8<sup>th</sup>. There are Masses at 9:00 AM and 7:30 PM.

Our annual edition of Lessons and Carols is Sunday, December 21<sup>st</sup> at 2:30 PM. All are invited to join in praise of God Who gives us His Son in the Incarnation.
