

Family members: please resubmit names for those who are ill. We will list them for four weeks, and then remove them unless told otherwise. Please note: due to privacy issues, we can include names given by the individual or a health care proxy only. Thank you. We still have Saint John the Baptist to consider on the Third Sunday of Advent. Last week, Saint John the Baptist cited the prophet Isaiah concerning his own mission: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." Regarding his work at the Jordan River, he said: "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I."

John wanted the people who came to him at the Jordan to see in their lives the things which prevented them from "bearing good fruit." We call that sin. With our sins, we call upon the Lord to forgive us and be merciful to us. As Catholics, we receive the Lord's forgiveness and His mercy through the Sacrament of Penance. As I indicated last Sunday, **this** Sunday's bulletin has an insert which permits us to celebrate sacramental confession well. We know it as an Examination of Conscience. I invite you to use it before you go to be reconciled with God in the days before Christmas.

There is a slightly longer period of confessions on the Saturday (the 20th) before Christmas. See the bulletin and the schedule which you received in the mail. As you know, there is also a Reconciliation Monday on December 22nd. Again, please see the bulletin boards in the church for the expanded hours related to the Sacrament of Penance.

The schedule you received in the mail for Christmas indicates that there is an hour (from 4:00 to 5:00 PM) on Monday the 22nd. This time falls outside the prescribed hours for Reconciliation Monday. Be assured though that there will be at least one priest available for the additional hour. We will honor our own schedule. The news of a Reconciliation Monday came **after** our schedule was submitted to the envelope company.

I encourage all parishioners to set aside some time to go to Confession before Christmas. With a copy of an Examination of Conscience in your grasp now, you are already part of the way to the Confessional. Make all your preparations for Christmas, including seeking the Lord's mercy and forgiveness.

I want to go back to the First Sunday of Advent and the column I wrote for the bulletin then. This concerns when Mass is being offered and when it is not. Let me repeat below what I wrote on November 30th.

There is a lot of noise in the church and we have to make more efforts and better efforts to be quiet and reverent in the Presence of Christ. Vocal prayer is important (at the right time and in the right way) but so is contemplation of the Mystery of God. He dwells with us always in every Catholic church (in the tabernacle). We take that Presence of Christ too much for granted when we talk at liberty right in front of the Blessed Sacrament. There is a time and place for socializing, and it is not in plain sight of the Eucharistic Lord.

And on another topic which deserves our attention, being on time for Mass.

Be on time for Mass – whether it is daily Mass or Sunday Mass, We want to concentrate on the whole of Mass – from the opening hymn to the closing hymn and all the parts of the Mass in between. Being on time is a way of respecting the Lord and our neighbors. It comes down to charity. Be attentive to God's Presence and the presence of your neighbors.

Our annual edition of *Lessons and Carols* is Sunday, December 21st. It begins at 2:30 PM in the church. It usually runs about one hour. Following the lessons and carols in the church, there is a reception in the church basement. At the reception, the Christmas Raffle prizes will be drawn.

In the event you have not yet purchased a ticket for the Raffle, you can still do so this weekend. There will be parishioners in the vestibule of the church before and after weekend Masses to accept your application for a ticket. This is the last opportunity to get a ticket. We are only selling 200 of them. Don't miss out!

Thinking a few weeks ahead now, during the Christmas Octave, we have the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God. It is the first day of 2026. Please be aware that we have but one Mass on January 1st, a Holy Day of Obligation. Its time is 10:00 AM.

Hospitality and the long-anticipated raffle drawing will be held immediately following in the auditorium.



Tell Congress to Stand Up for Religious Workers

Catholic parishes, hospitals, schools and other ministries are facing a staffing crisis caused by federal policy, as foreign-born priests, religious sisters & brothers get caught up in the bureaucratic red tape of our broken immigration system. A bipartisan bill has been introduced in Congress to address the issue, making it easier for religious workers here legally on temporary visas to remain in the country until they can get a green card. Currently, because of a backlog in applications for the specific permanent visas these individuals need, many are forced to leave the country for a year, leaving our ministries unstaffed and our Catholic people without access to sacraments and spiritual care. Please contact Senators Schumer & Gillibrand and your member of Congress to urge them to pass the Religious Workforce Protection Act this year!
