The cold of the winter season makes us yearn for the warmth of places like Florida. You're lucky if you can get to a warmer climate if just for a few days. As I write this column, the weather forecast is showing a major snowstorm for Sunday the 25th. What will happen? I don't know at this early juncture. It's always best, though, to prepare intelligently for the worst-case scenario. We'll see soon enough.

With the likelihood of more bad weather on the horizon then, I want to treat an issue with very real consequences for parish life, and that would be the financial support that comes from parishioners. You will recall that I like to use two words in reference to the giving habits of Catholics to their parishes. The two words are: **generous** and **sacrificial**. Your giving must have these two attributes in order to be good stewards. Yes, that's what we should all strive after: being good stewards not just of my time and talent but of my **treasure**. Being generous and sacrificial though are conceptual in nature.

What we need to do is make our generosity and sacrifice operational. And that would involve mathematics and numbers. What do I write on my envelope alongside \$? And what do I write in my checkbook alongside Saint Margaret RC Church?

Thus far, we have had snowfalls three times before this weekend. There were two in December and one earlier in this month. Every time it snows, we have to spend money to remove the white stuff on the ground and make sure the pathways are salted and sanded. And then there are the parking spaces that have to be cleared. All of these acts cost hundreds and even thousands of \$\$\$ (labor, equipment, and products) per snowfall.

I ask all parishioners to consider thoughtfully and carefully what you are contributing to Saint Margaret Parish currently. Is that contribution really **generous** and **sacrificial**? Have I increased my offering to my parish to take into account the rise in the cost of living in the last few years?

We have some parishioners who are exceptionally generous and sacrificial in their giving. But not enough of them, unfortunately. I call upon those who have not yet shown generosity and sacrifice in their giving to step up and help your parish. Without your generosity and sacrifice, we fail as a whole to practice a satisfactory stewardship.

As for my next subject in this column, I want to address another sensitive topic for church-goers and that would be the eclipse of reverence inside the church. By now, you have heard me comment from time to time on how we should conduct ourselves in the Presence of our God. And that's why, for example, we ought to use genuflections because they reflect the truth that Christ is really with us under the appearance of bread and wine. We can't see that truth with our own eyes. But we profess it, or we ought to profess it, in our conduct.

A part of the reverence which should prevail in Catholic churches is the elimination of unnecessary noise. Pardon me for saying so, but there is far too much noise in our church.

Reverence has a lot to do with place. And, by that, I mean that our conduct is right and appropriate for what takes place there. It is undeniable that worship takes place in church. Our worship is directed to God Who dwells there. Without silence, we are less inclined to be mindful of the very purpose of being in church. It's what Moses forgot and had to be reminded of when he was at Horeb, the mountain of God. (Ex 3:!) Although the burning bush, the sign of God's Presence, was not consumed (Ex 3:2), Moses still had to be reminded: "Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground." (Ex 3:5)

We do not make the church holy, God does. Let us therefore make better efforts to reduce the noise level in our church. There is plenty of time for socializing *elsewhere*. But when it comes to where God dwells, let us endeavor to be quiet there. Quiet are our hearts that we may hear the softest whispers of God there.

In a future column, I want to address some other aspects about our worship.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we celebrate Catholic Schools Week, I give thanks for the extraordinary gift of Catholic education and for the students, families, educators, clergy, and benefactors who make our schools thrive across Long Island.

This year's observance begins on *Word of God Sunday*, reminding us that Sacred Scripture is not merely studied, but proclaimed, prayed, and lived. In our Catholic schools, the Word of God forms minds and hearts and draws students into a lifelong relationship with Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh.

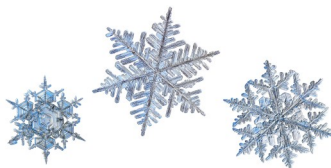
